Juneteenth is the observed date of the emancipation of enslaved people in the United States. Honoring the June 19, 1865 proclamation of freedom for enslaved people, it officially became a federal holiday last year to commemorate Black liberation, education and achievement. Each of us can reflect on how far we've come since and acknowledge that work still needs to be done in pursuit of equality and social equity.

We all have a role to play to continue to effect change – perhaps looking back to the innovators who came before can inspire us as we move forward.

In 1906, O.W. Gurley purchased land near Tulsa, Oklahoma, which would later become known as Black Wall Street. He rallied a community of entrepreneurs and built a thriving city center in Greenwood. Sadly, in 1921, a white mob burned down 35 once-bustling blocks in one of the most devastating acts of racial violence and domestic terrorism in the United States. The incident led to loss of life and livelihood. While some fled Tulsa, others stayed to not just rebuild their homes but to also rebuild community landmarks, like the Dreamland Theatre, Vernon AME Church and Mount Zion Baptist Church. (The latter two and other historic sites are open to visitors today.)

Ernesta Procope planted the first Black-owned business on Wall Street in New York when she moved her insurance business, E.G. Bowman, from Brooklyn in 1979. She became a powerful voice and advocate for insurance reform that offered fair coverage for low-income families.

Years later, Daymond John blazed another path when he started FUBU. The successful clothing brand has garnered \$8 billion as of 2022. Now, he's well-known as an angel investor on "Shark Tank," having invested millions of dollars to help promising entrepreneurs make their own dreams come true.
